Pursuant to the National Historic Lighthouse Preservation Act of 2000 (NHLPA)16 U.S.C. 470, this Property is being made available at no cost to eligible entities defined as Federal agencies, state and local agencies, non-profit corporations, educational agencies, or community development organizations for educational, park, recreational, cultural or historic preservation purposes.

Any eligible entity with an interest in acquiring the described property for a use consistent with the purposes stated above should submit a letter of interest to the address listed below by 60 (sixty) days from the date of this Notice.

Letters of interest should include:

- Name of property
- Name of eligible entity
- Point of contact, title, address, phone and email
- Non-profit agencies must provide a copy of their state-certified articles of incorporation

Eligible entities which submit a written letter of interest will be sent an application from the United States Department of the Interior and given an opportunity to inspect the property. Building inspectors and/or contractors may accompany the applicant on the site visit. The completed application must be submitted to the Dept. of Interior within 90 days after site inspection. The Dept. of Interior will review applications and may select a steward to receive the Property. The General Services Administration (GSA) will deed the Property to the selected steward.

Property Identification	Little Gull Island Light Station ("the Property") - offshore
Address	Located seven miles northeast of Orient Point, Suffolk County, New York, where Block Island Sound and Long Island Sound meet. On the eastern end of Long Island Sound, between Plum and Fisher's Islands. Approximate location: 41 12' 23" N 72 06' 25" W
Description	Little Gull Island Light Station (1806) is a five-story, 81-foot conical granite tower with a 19 foot diamter at base and walls 5.5 feet thick on a concrete foundation. The architectural style is Second Empire with distinctive door lintel, cast iron central tower, stairs and watch deck floor. Present tower first constructed and lit in 1869. Sits on approximately one acre of land above high water and is surrounded by rocky reefs.
Condition of Property	Marks one of the most dangerous waterways in the Northeast. ("The Race"). An active aid to navigation owned by the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG). The Property is offered "AS IS' and "WHERE IS"
	without representation, warranty, or guarantee as to quality, quantity, title, character, condition, size or kind.
Range of Possible Uses	Historic Lights may be obtained for educational, park, recreational, cultural, or historic preservation purposes.
Commercial Activities	Commercial activities are prohibited unless approved by the Secretary of the Interior.
Historical Information	Property is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and must be maintained according to the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. Historic covenants will be incorporated into the deed.

Aid to Navigation (ATON)	ATON will remain the personal property of USCG. Solar powered, active, automated. Fog signal: one blast every 15 seconds. Flashing white light every 15 seconds.
Easements to be retained by the U.S. Coast Guard	 a 360 degree Arc of Visibility easement; nothing will be constructed, maintained or permitted of a height exceeding 25 feet on a plane emanating from the center of the light; an easement for an unrestricted right of access for ingress and egress, to and across the Property to maintain, operate,

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	 service, repair, and replace equipment as necessary to support its ATON mission; 3) the unrestricted right to relocate or add any aids to navigation or communications towers and equipment (along with necessary right of egress/ingress), or make any changes on any portion of the Property as may be necessary for navigation/public safety purposes.
