## Straitsmouth Island Light County of Essex, Massachusetts July 11, 2008

The property, Straitsmouth Island Light (Straitsmouth), described on the attached fact sheet has been determined to be excess to the needs of the United States Coast Guard (USCG). Pursuant to the National Historic Lighthouse Preservation Act of 2000, 16 U.S.C. 470, this property is being made available at no cost to eligible entities defined as federal, state and local agencies, non-profit corporations, educational agencies, or community development organizations, for education, park, recreation, cultural, or historic preservation purposes.

In the event no applicant is approved for the no cost conveyance of Straitsmouth pursuant to section 308 of the act, it shall be offered for public sale. Historic covenants will be included in all deeds.

Any eligible entity with an interest in acquiring Straitsmouth for a use consistent with the purposes stated above, should submit a letter of interest to the address listed below by September 8, 2008.

Letters of interest should include:

- Name of property
- Name of eligible entity
- Point of contact, title, address, phone and email
- Non-profit agencies must provide a copy of their state-certified articles of incorporation

Eligible entities that submit a letter of interest will be sent an application by the U.S. Department of the Interior and given an opportunity to inspect the property, in an open house forum. Building inspectors and/or contractors may accompany the applicant on the open house site visit. The completed application must be submitted to the U.S. Department of the Interior within 90 days of the open house. The U.S. Department of the Interior will review applications and select an eligible entity to receive the property. The U.S. General Services Administration will complete the conveyance to the selected recipient.

The light structure consists of a 37 foot cylindrical brick/asphalt tower on a foundation of granite setting directly on bedrock (built in 1835). The surrounding land area and structures thereon are owned by the Massachusetts Audubon Society as part of the Ipswich River Wildlife Sanctuary. Access to surrounding land and improvements are closed to the general public.
Condition of Property	The property is offered "AS IS' and "WHERE IS" without representation, warranty, or guarantee as to quality, quantity, title, character, condition, size or kind.
Range of Possible Uses	Historic Lights may be obtained for educational, park, recreational, cultural, or historic preservation purposes.
Commercial Activities	Commercial activities are prohibited unless approved by the Secretary of the Interior.
Historical Information	Property is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, reference number #87001487. Property must be maintained according to the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. Historic covenants will be incorporated into the deed.

Aid to Navigation (ATON)	ATON will remain the personal property of USCG. One small electrical room on the second level will remain for exclusive use by the USCG.

Easements – to be retained by USCG	1) An easement to the USCG for the purpose of preserving an Arc of Visibility within the radial arc of 360 degrees for Straitsmouth Island Lighthouse with the stipulation that nothing will be constructed maintained or permitted of a height sufficient to interfere with or obstruct the Arc of Visibility of said light.
	2) An easement for an unrestricted right of access for ingress and egress, to and across the Property to maintain, operate, service, repair, and replace equipment as necessary to support its ATON mission; and
	3) The unrestricted right to relocate or add any aids to navigation or communications towers and equipment (along with necessary right of egress/ingress), or make any changes on any portion of the Property as may be necessary for navigation/public safety purposes.
	4) An easement to the USCG for the purpose of sounding, in certain weather conditions a sound signal.
